Illinois Updates:

<u>ISDS</u>

- Governor Signs ISDS Workforce Legislation to address workforce shortages in the dental office. The law will take effect on January 1, 2023.
- <u>Governor Signs Bill for Insurance Coverage for Children with Cranial Facial Anomalies.</u> <u>Health insurance companies will be required to provide coverage for the medically</u> <u>necessary care and treatment of cleft lip and palate for children under 19. The effective</u> <u>date is set for January 1, 2024.</u>
- <u>State of Illinois maintains Executive Order requiring dental offices to test unvaccinated</u> <u>staff weekly and require universal masking in the office.</u>
- ISDS submitted a letter to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) in response to proposal by Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation

that would change the Illinois Dental Practice Act regarding on-site emergency kits, telehealth provisions, and changes to anesthesia requirements.

<u>ISO</u>

Defining our future: ISO is trying to determine how to improve attendance at live CE meetings. We have changed format to a half-day meeting, trying a Friday meeting versus Monday, changed venues to determine a good fit for our organization, hosted a wine and cheese social hour after one meeting, and are working on different types of speakers that are pertinent to a wider audience. We are focusing on quality speakers and trying to determine topics that will be appealing to new and younger dentists.

Board Structure: The board is developing committees to simplify/streamline tasks for future officers. A "buddy system" for trustees to partner with officers to get exposed to each committee is being drafted.

University Relations:

- University of Illinois Chicago over 400 applicants to residency and 60 interviews are pending.
- Southern Illinois University starting a New Residency Program offering 2 resident positions. Application deadline is December.

Congratulations to Dr. **Randall Markarian** as the new 8th district Trustee to the ADA representing Illinois. As he serves the ADA, I look forward to stepping into his role as the Illinois Director to MSO. I have been a trustee with the Illinois State Dental Society and look forward to maintaining communication between our specialty and the ISDS.

The 2022 Iowa Society of Orthodontists (ISO) meeting was held October 2-3 in Iowa City. Sunday's agenda included speakers from the University of Iowa, Department of Orthodontics and was held at the College of Dentistry. On Monday, Dr. **Neal Kravitz** offered his *Orthodontic Pearls*. His experience as both a private practice clinician and a teacher, as well as his positive energy and love for orthodontics, made for an educational and enjoyable day.

Thanks in part to the dedication of several representatives from the ISO working with an Iowa Dental Board (IDB) committee, there are some favorable proposed changes to the Iowa Administrative Code pertaining to Registered Dental Assistants (RDA) that will have a positive impact on orthodontists in the state of Iowa. The first proposed changes provide a more realistic pathway for candidates to become registered dental assistants by eliminating several barriers to achieving RDA status. The second proposed changes address barriers to orthodontic assistants to achieve Expanded Function status by separating placement of orthodontic bonding systems from applying cavity liners and bases/desensitizing agents. We are hopeful these changes will be adopted when reviewed by the entire IDB at a future meeting.

After a two-year hiatus due to COVID-19, the Iowa Mission of Mercy (IMOM) is being held November 4-5, 2022, in Des Moines. The last time IMOM was held in Des Moines, over 1,400 patients were treated and provided with nearly \$1 million in free dental care. Since IMOM began in 2008, thousands of dentists, dental professionals, and lay volunteers from across the state have come together to provide over \$10 million of free dental care to more than 15,000 patients.

The top priority of the Iowa Dental Association (IDA) during the 2023 Legislative Session is continuing efforts to increase Dental Wellness Plan (Medicaid) reimbursement rates to match Hawk-I rates. Medicaid rates in Iowa have not increased in Iowa in 20+ years.

• The 2023 Canadian Association of Orthodontists (CAO) meeting will be held at the Walt Disney World Resort in Florida on September 27-30.

Recent Activities:

• Due to the ongoing need of orthodontic assistants in Manitoba, 10 local orthodontists accepted to teach in the ortho module offered by the Red River College from May to June 2023.

• The Manitoba Dental Association (MDA) has opened a consultation process on a proposed bylaw for the use of Neuromodulators and Dermal Fillers. Members have been encouraged to ask questions related to the bylaw.

• One of the University of Manitoba full-time orthodontic professors resigned, so the College is in the process of advertising a new position. Therefore, a position will be open soon. In Canada, it has been increasingly difficult to hire orthodontic faculty as most licensed orthodontists prefer to work in private practice.

• Two new orthodontic residents started their orthodontic program last July at the University of Manitoba. They are both from Winnipeg.

• A new graduate orthodontist raised a concern that the AAO career search tool does not allow the use of "Canada" as a key word option. When this key word is used, the webpage automatically changes it to "Canada in Kansas", "Canada in Texas", and even "Canada in Colombia".

South Dakota Medicaid has announced several improvements to the dental benefit. The yearly maximum for adult Medicaid dental services has increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000. This applies to all adult Medicaid recipients ages 21 and older. Some services are exempted from the annual max. These services include two exams, two cleanings and two sets of bitewings. Emergent dental services and dentures and partial dentures are also exempt when corresponding documentation is submitted with the claim. Medicaid will also cover sealants once in a 2-year period. Severe pain or swelling will be considered a medically necessary reason for extraction of third molars. In addition, if extraction of one third molar is considered medically necessary, all third molars proposed for extraction will be approved.

No changes have been made to Medicaid coverage for orthodontics. KELO, the local news station, recently did a story on the gap in coverage when it comes to orthodontics.

This November, Medicaid expansion will be voted on. Further changes might ensue.



The MSO Earl E. Shepard Distinguished Service Award was created in 1987 to honor Dr. Shepard and recognize those orthodontists who perform service to mankind in a combination of service to orthodontics and service in other areas of dentistry and/or their state or local community. The Board of Directors of the MSO unanimously selected Dr. **Thomas M. Stark** of Ames, lowa as the 2022 MSO Earl E. Shepard Distinguished Service Award recipient.

Tom attended Iowa State University where he earned his BS in Distributed Studies in 1980, and then he received his DDS from the University of Iowa in 1983. Tom was blessed to be accepted into the Baylor

Department of Orthodontics in Dallas, Texas, where he received his MSD degree in 1985.

Tom and his college sweetheart wife, Cindy, then moved back to Ames, and they now live two blocks away from their respective fraternity and sorority houses where they first met. Greetings from Mayo Clinic!



The American Board of Orthodontics 2022 Constituency Report

Fall 2022

The ABO is committed to upholding our mission to elevate the quality of orthodontic care for the public by promoting excellence through certification, education, and professional collaboration.

ABO Yearly Update

Clinical Examination Update:

 The ABO conducted Scenario-based Clinical Examinations in February, July and November, 2021 and February 2022. A total of 1,175 examinees were certified or recertified during 2021 and the 1st and 2nd quarters of 2022. Listings by constituency for all examinations are located on the <u>ABO website</u>.

Upcoming Clinical Examinations are scheduled for October 2022 and February 2023. Online registration for these examinations can be accessed through the <u>ABO website</u>.

Following the successful completion of the ABO Written Examination and graduating from a CODA accredited advanced specialty education program in orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics in the United States or Canada, the orthodontic professional may register for the ABO Scenario-based Clinical Examination. The examination is composed of four domains using ABO provided patient cases and is designed to objectively evaluate an orthodontist's knowledge, abilities and critical thinking skills. The examination is graded on a pass/fail basis and scored by multiple ABO examiners to ensure accuracy and consistency. Clinical Examinations are held at Pearson Vue Testing Centers worldwide with travel to St. Louis no longer required.

Preparation materials are routinely updated and are located on the ABO website and include a study guide, sample cases and videos. Tools previously created to assess case outcomes will continue to be used within the scenario-based examination process, including the Electronic

Cast Radiograph, Case Management Form and cephalometric superimposition technique and interpretation. Electronic Cast Radiograph Evaluation (CRE) grading has been added as an additional assessment tool thru Ortho Share 3D and is available free of charge by completing the registration information on the ABO website and submitting a license agreement to access the software. The ABO also suggests examinees complete an objective analysis of patient cases as these critical thinking exercises will strengthen an examinee's skillset when preparing for the examination while providing an opportunity for self-evaluation on case outcomes.

The ABO is excited to announce that board certified orthodontists now account for 58% of AAO orthodontists in the specialty. Reaching this significant level of certification is an important accomplishment. Board certification allows us to have a stronger voice to make a collective impact on setting the standard of care for our specialty. Please take a moment to view the video, "Leading the Specialty" celebrating this milestone. We are leading the way, together.

Certification Renewal:

Certification Renewal is required every 10 years for board certified orthodontists to
remain in an active status while pursuing the commitment to lifelong learning and
personal dedication to excellence. For those who have Lifetime certification in place,
voluntary certification renewal is encouraged. The renewal process may be started 36
months prior to the expiration date printed on the board-certified orthodontist's
certificate. There are two options from which to choose to satisfy this requirement:
Complete an online board case examination consisting of an average of 50 multiple
choice questions (BCE); OR case report examination (CRE) for one case with a DI of 10 or
greater submitted by mail. Continuing Education credits via online AJODO publications
are required for both options. The ABO routinely distributes reminder emails, letters
and mailed pieces to those up for renewal. This Motion Graphic Video outlines the
process. A study guide is located on the ABO website to prepare for the examination.

Written Examination Update:

The 2022 ABO Written Examination was administered to 412 examinees on April 5, 2022 at Pearson Vue Testing Centers in the United States and Canada with a 90% pass rate. The ABO Written Examination is a comprehensive exam that assesses the examinee's knowledge of basic sciences and clinical concepts based on criterion-referenced testing. The examination is composed of 240 multiple-choice questions on subject areas outlined by CODA divided into 4 modules. Requirements, eligibility and examination resources, and the most current reading list, are all located on the <u>ABO website</u>. Once the examination is successfully completed, it does not expire.

Educational Update:

- The ABO conducted a Written Standard Meeting in St. Louis, MO April 27-29, 2022. Attendees participated in a benchmarking exercise for the examination.
- The ABO's campaign, "<u>It Takes A Specialist</u>", on the importance of using an orthodontic specialist, continues to evolve, with additional online digital components offered showcasing a variety of tools which require talent for success. The video has been met with favorable response and is available for use by board certified orthodontists in their offices and social media channels.
- The ABO continues to update online Educational Toolkit resources for board certified orthodontists. Items include brochures, suggested website copy, patient and team materials, videos, window clings, Brand Standards Guide and pathway graphic. Each doctor has access to their own personalized online dashboard which allows multiple office listings on the public online orthodontist locator, user-specific notifications, tracking of personal CE credit hours and the ability to print a complimentary verification letter.
- The ABO's website has been upgraded with benefits including improved functionality and overall enhanced user experience with easier access to online tools.

- Complimentary ABO measuring gauges for new residents will be provided to requesting CODA-accredited orthodontic programs.
- The ABO Advocacy Program continues to be successful with an ABO-appointed advocate volunteer assigned to each CODA accredited orthodontic program in the United States and Canada. The program will be evaluated to ensure content and communications continue to meet the specific needs of the schools.
