MSO EARL E. SHEPARD DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD DR. JOHN KANYUSIK

The Midwestern Society of Orthodontists proudly announces that Dr. John Kanyusik is the recipient of the 2015 MSO Earl E. Shepard Distinguished Service Award. This award recognizes a member of the MSO who exemplifies the ideals of the orthodontic profession, community and family.

Dr. Kanyusik was born in Washington, D.C. and raised in northern Minnesota and California. He received his DDS from the University of Minnesota in 1970 and graduated from

Minnesota's Orthodontic program in 1972. Dr. Robert Isaacson was the program chair at that time and John and his classmates were greatly influenced by Isaacson's strong leadership and commitment to evidenced-based practice.

Following graduation John served in the USAF in Tachikawa, Japan and was able to travel extensively in the Far East. As his time in Air Force neared completion, his future wife, Carolyn, suggested that they meet in Europe and travel before going back

home. Together they spent three months as travel bums and after 40-plus years, they are still enjoying the journey.

While serving in Japan, John was contacted by Drs. Powers and Germundson in Mankato, Minnesota and was offered a position that he accepted in 1975. John and Carolyn have lived in Mankato since and have raised their four children there. He currently practices with Drs. Carlin Wiemers, Tim Swanson and Chris Vaubel at Southern Minnesota Orthodontics.

Early in his career John found Drs. Jim Gjerset, Roger Fredsall and Arnie Hill to be great mentors and examples in finding ways to give back to the orthodontic profession. John has served on the Boards and as president of the Minnesota Association of Orthodontists (MAO) and the MSO. He has served on the MSO delegation to the American Association of Orthodontists (AAO) House since 2005, as chair on the AAO Council on Membership Ethics and Judicial Concerns and on numerous AAO and AAOF committees. He served as staff program co-chair for the 2003 AAO Annual Session in Hawaii and as the general chair and scientific chair at numerous orthodontic meetings. He will serve as general chair of the 2019 AAO meeting in Los Angeles. He has lectured at numerous orthodontic programs and meetings, both nationally and internationally.

John has been active in the College of Diplomates of the

American Board of Orthodontics (CDABO) since receiving his board certification in 1984. His involvement began when he helped develop the early courses offered by the College to encourage American Board of Orthodontics (ABO) certification in 1985. In 1992 John was elected to the CDABO Council and served as CDABO President at the 2001 Sun Valley meeting. He continues to serve on the ABO/CDABO Resident Advocacy Committee as its co-chair and on the CDABO Foundation Board, John was ABO recertified in 2001 and has served as an ABO Phase III Examination Consultant since 2002.

John is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists and has received service awards from the MAO, CDABO and ABO. Since 2002 he has taught part-time at the University of Minnesota's Department of Orthodontics.

John and Carolyn are involved in many Mankato organizations including ECHO, the area food

shelf, Habitat for Humanity, YMCA, United Way, local trail projects and their church.

For several years John has been active with Health Volunteers Overseas (HVO), an organization that places volunteers in schools where one can teach the local educators and then those educators teach their students after the volunteer leaves. John has taught with HVO in Vietnam, Tanzania, Moldova, Nicaragua and, soon, in Nepal. You may occasionally hear his voice as he currently is a reviewer on the AAO Oakstone literature reviews.






Optimizing Bone Health Across the Life Span

Peak bone mass is achieved in early adulthood and is the culmination of genetic, hormonal and environmental factors. Bone mass changes during adulthood are the consequence of aging and disease. This talk will review the changes in bone mass over the lifespan and the implications for fracture risk. Learning Objectives:

- Recognize the decline in bone mass as a risk for fracture in aging.

and Internal Medicine as well as Professor in Cancer Genomics Research.

"Precision Medicine" involves the application of genomics and other "omic" sciences to make it possible to better individualize the diagnosis, treatment and – ultimately – the prevention of human disease. In his "State of the Union Address" this year, President Obama announced a national "Precision Medicine Initiative". Dr. Kumar is Associate Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Pediatric Endocrinology and Metabolism at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. She received her M.D. from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences in New Delhi, India. She completed her residency in general pediatrics in 2000 and a fellowship in pediatric endocrinology and metabolism at

Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in 2003. Her interests include the treatment of childhood obesity, type 2 diabetes and related cardiometabolic risk factors.

Obesity in Our Children and the Long Term Effects on the Health of These Individuals

The presentation will review the epidemiology of childhood obesity and factors that have contributed to the recent epidemic of childhood obesity. The presentation will include discussion on several morbidities associated with childhood obesity including type 2 diabetes mellitus, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, sleep apnea, orthopedic complications, and psycho-social sequelae. The increased predisposition of obese children, particularly adolescents, to become obese adults will be reviewed. In addition, in obese adolescents, increased risk of multiple comorbidities in adulthood, even if the obesity did not persist will be reviewed. Increased risk of several cancers with obesity will be discussed.

Dr. Pruthi received her M.D. from the University of Manitoba, Canada in 1990 and then completed a Family Medicine residency at the Mayo Clinic in 1994. She is an Associate Professor of Medicine. Dr. Pruthi is the co-Women's Specialty Editor of MayoClinic.org, medical director for Patient Experience at Mayo Clinic Rochester

and leads the Mayo Clinic women's health section of AskMayoExpert.

Women at Increased Risk for Breast Cancer: An Individualized Approach – Strategies to Reduce Risk

New research in lifestyle factors such as physical activity, alcohol use and weight management are associated with breast cancer risk and prognosis. Breast cancer risk calculation models and availability to genetic testing has improved the identification of breast cancer risk to guide a personalized approach in the management of high-risk women and those with hereditary predisposition. Surveillance with mammography in conjunction with breast magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) in very high-risk women or those with a breast cancer genetic mutation has been shown to be more sensitive in detection of breast cancer. Pharmacologic therapy also known as chemoprevention with tamoxifen, raloxifene (selective estrogen receptor modulators) and exemestane (aromatase inhibitors) has demonstrated a substantial reduction in breast cancer risk among women with high risk or precancerous breast lesions. Learning Objectives:

- Illustrate new breast imaging modalities for surveillance and early detection of breast cancer
- Use breast cancer risk calculation models to aid in the identification of breast cancer risk and tailor appropriate risk reducing strategies.

Personalized Orthodontic Appliances: Where Are We Headed and Why Do We Need Them?

Advances in 3D imaging, digital model technology, CAD/CAM, and robotics have catalyzed the development of personalized appliance systems for orthodontic treatment. These systems allow clinicians to manipulate 3D models of patients' teeth to simulate orthodontic treatment. Machines then fabricate the appliances with the necessary geometry to complete treatment according to the virtual treatment plan. This session will:




